LIFE-CHANGE OBJECTIVE

 To give you deep and lasting confidence in your God-given ability to understand the Bible.

Remember the three words: revelation, inspiration, illumination?

- *Revelation* has been completed (Hebrews 1:1-2)
- *Inspiration* has been completed (1 Peter 1:10-12)
- *Illumination* is going on right now.

PSALM 18:28 (NLT)

You light a lamp for me. The Lord, my God, lights up my darkness.

PSALM 119:105

Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light for my path.

Illumination

Illumination is the supernatural influence or ministry of the Holy Spirit, which enables all who believe in Christ to understand the Scriptures.

Picture it this way: With his revelation and by his inspiration, God sent the light of his Word into our world. Through illumination, the blinders are taken off our eyes so we can see the light that is already there.

Four things are necessary for illumination in a believer's life:

PSALM 119:97 (NCV)

How I love your teachings! I think about them all day long.

PSALM 119:127 (NLT)

Truly, I love your commands more than gold, even the finest gold.

PROVERBS 2:3-6

And if you call out for insight and cry aloud for understanding, and if you look for it as for silver and search for it as for hidden treasure, then you will understand the fear of the Lord and find the knowledge of God. For the Lord gives wisdom, and from his mouth come knowledge and understanding.

Two truths about every believer in Christ:				
1. The Holy Spirit makes methe Bible.	to understand			

1 CORINTHIANS 2:12–14 (NLT)

And we have received God's Spirit (not the world's spirit), so we can know the wonderful things God has freely given us. When we tell you these things, we do not use words that come from human wisdom. Instead, we speak words given to us by the Spirit, using the Spirit's words to explain spiritual truths. But people who aren't spiritual can't receive these truths from God's Spirit. It all sounds foolish to them and they can't understand it, for only those who are spiritual can understand what the Spirit means.

JOHN 16:13

"But when he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all truth."

2. The Holy Spirit make me ______ for understanding the Bible.

1 JOHN 2:20, 27

But you have an anointing from the Holy One, and all of you know the truth . . . As for you, the anointing you received from him remains in you, and you do not need anyone to teach you. But as his anointing teaches you about all things and as that anointing is real, not counterfeit — just as it has taught you, remain in him.

SEVEN RULES OF BIBLE STUDY
Rule 1: Faith and the Holy Spirit are necessary for proper interpretation.
Rule 2: The Bible interprets itself. APPLICATION: Learn to do cross-reference studies.
Rule 3: Understand the Old Testament in light of the .

Rule 4: Understand unclear passages in the light ofpassages. EXAMPLE:

Rule 5: Understand words and verses in the light of their

LUKE 12:19
"Take life easy; eat, drink, and be merry."
Rule 6: Understand historical passages in the light ofpassages.
EXAMPLES:
DEUTERONOMY 17:17 (NLT)
"The king must not take many wives for himself, because they will turn his heart away from the Lord."
MARK 1:35
Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed.
Rule 7: Understand personal experience in the light of Scripture.
EXAMPLE:
ROMANS 13:8 (NASB)
Owe nothing to anyone.

STUDY GOD'S WORD _____

How do you decide to study God's Word as a lifetime commitment?

1. Vow before the Lord to trust in and commit to the truth of his Word.

1 TIMOTHY 4:15-16

Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them.

2. Cultivate eagerness by examining God's Word for answers.

ACTS 17:11

They [the Bereans] received the message with great eagerness and examined the Scriptures every day to see if what Paul said was true.

3. Tell others what you're learning from God's Word.

COLOSSIANS 3:16

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly as you teach and admonish one another with all wisdom.

4. Act on what you learn as you study the Bible.

JAMES 1:22

Do not merely listen to the word, and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says.
